

North Paraparaumu Beach Cross Submission.

The summary of Don Frampton's submission was poorly summarised by KCDC and the issue of sand extractions is an unfair omission – Don Frampton made it quite clear in what he seeks in his numbered point on page 1 of his submission ;

*“2. I oppose the coastal hazard lines shown on the Paraparaumu Beach North map because, as they relate to this section of the Kapiti Coast in particular, I believe the supporting science is extraordinarily deficient. I ask that before any hazard line placement is considered pursuant to 1. above, that a more representative (longer term) trend be used in this Paraparaumu Beach North area to determine more accurate and representative hazard line positions. Such trend should be based on an historic period of (say) 50 years or so with **a credit-allowance for the erosion effects of all unnatural (KCDC/man-made) sand excavations.** I believe this would reposition the lines seaward by at least 30 metres meaning most properties in this area would not currently have lines across their properties.”*

He is seeking a correction to read:

Seek that a credit-allowance in the Paraparaumu Beach map area for the erosion effects of all unnatural (KCDC/man-made) sand excavations in that area be incorporated into the Coastal Hazard Assessment before such report is relied upon as a reasonable guide for Proposed District Plan purposes.

To the attention of Manly Street residents particularly

CRU suggests that Manly Street residents in particular support Don's submission in their further cross submissions.

Given the removal of sand from stormwater clearances (for transport to Marine Parade) took place over a 10 year period. So **sand volume was indeed lost across the whole of Manly Street.** The 65,000m³ volume of sand which Lumsden estimated is HUGE. For comparative purposes – Greater Wellington imported 6,000m³ to create the false beach at Oriental Parade... so more than 10 Oriental Parade beaches were excavated and removed from Manly Street/Paraparaumu Beach as a result of Council actions.
